On January 25, 2014 I received from the Prosecutors Office of West Virginia Jury Instruction for a case that has been asked to be dismissed numerous times on due process, habeas corpus, and evidence. Furthermore since the hearing with Justice Booth; this is the first communication received from the State of West Virginia. However, **the purpose of this letter is the editing of STATUES in instructions to Jury Members**. Three charges have been filed and as stated previously no evidence has been provided that match the STATUES found in West Virginia Criminal Codes.

Please explain why the State Prosecutor Office has a template of Statues that do not follow the State of West Virginia Statues a form of deception and corruption. As you yourself are an attorney you are aware of and, or, and the importance of the order of words. Furthermore you are aware of Freedom of Speech and true threats.

For all West Virginias or persons that are being tried by Judge or Jury, I hope you will ask the State Prosecutor Office intent in using edited or selective leaving out sections of Statues that change the context of the Statue.
